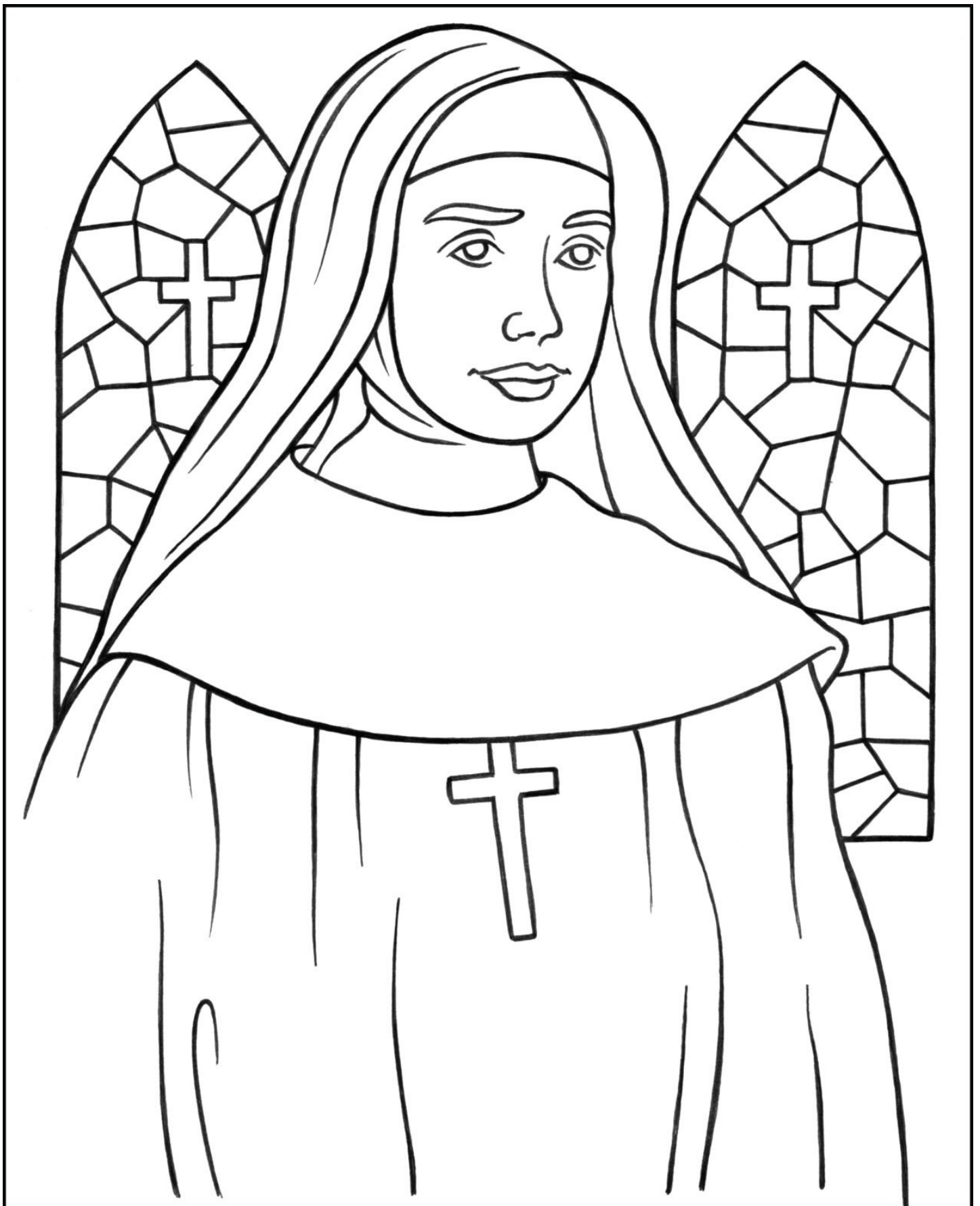

Pray for Vocations

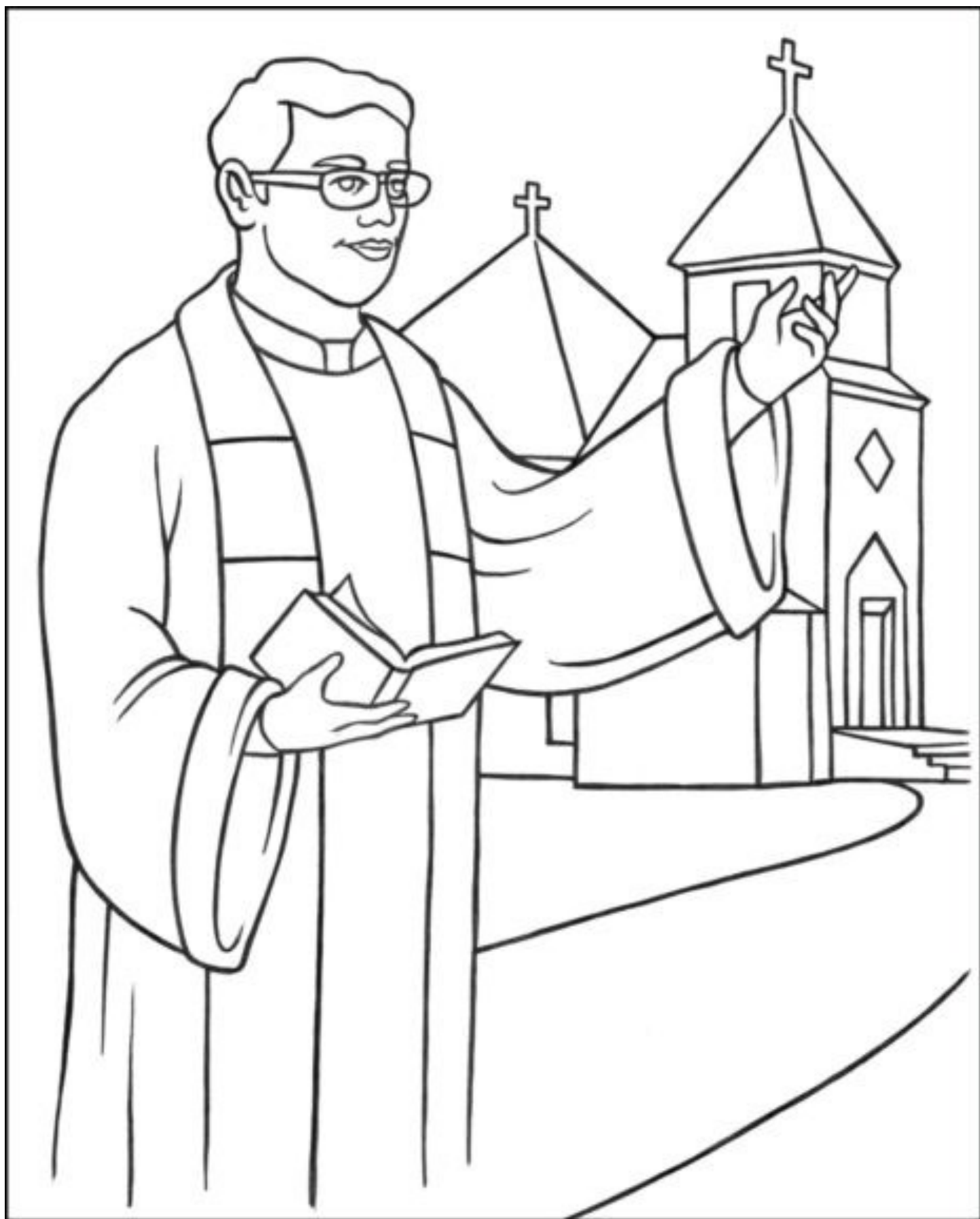
